A SHORT OUTLINE HISTORY OF THE SOUTHERN TENNIS ASSOCIATION (SOUTHERN LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION)

The Southern Tennis Association is an old and honored organization. The date of its' formation is buried in the past. Yet, undoubtedly, information is in existence which could determine this date. For purposes of this brief history, let us say that 1886, the date used for listing of our first champion is the beginning year date of the Southern Lawn Tennis Association.

We are not alone in this confusion. The United States Lawn Tennis Association (U.S.T.A.) struck a fiftieth anniversary medal in 1931 which would make their beginning in 1881.

As many of you know, the same organization celebrated its centennial in 1974. A medal was also struck for this celebration showing the date of 1874 as the beginning. These two medals thus show a difference of seven years.

In Tawn Tennis Rules 1888-1889" page 52 the following appears "....At the annual meeting held in New York City on February 15th of this year, the constitution was changed so that membership of the Association now includes not only clubs, but Associations of clubs as well. This move was occasioned by the organization in different sections of the country of Sectional Associations, e.g. the Southern Association...."

Also, in Lawn Tennis Rules 1888-1889 page 68 the following appears, "June 5th and 6th Tournament of the Southern Lawn Tennis Association, on the grounds of the Baltimore Cricket Club,...."

Also, in the Lawn Tennis Guide 1892 page 211 appears "Southern Lawn Tennis Association".

The Lawn Tennis Guide 1893 page 13 the following, "....At the annual meeting held in New York City on February 15, 1889, the Constitution was changed so that membership of the Association now includes not only clubs but associations of clubs as well..."

Whatever the exact date of the beginning of the STA, we can proudly say with certainty that the oldest tennis club in the United States is in the Southern. This is the New Orleans' Lawn Tennis Club. Organized in 1876, it is a year older than famous Longwood in Boston and the Seabright of New Jersey. There were twenty original founders and they were a large factor in the development of Southern Tennis. Englishmen over here to learn the cotton business introduced and developed an interest in the game. The early courts were grass. Club rules were interesting.

Here are two:

"First on the grounds to have choice of nets."

"On Tuesday one court can be retained for a match game, to consist of two of three rubbers, the latter to be four out of seven games."

There was no playing on Sunday.

Dues in 1883 was \$15.00 per year.

The Club in those days furnished balls, rackets, and nets.

The New Orleans Lawn Tennis Club joined the U.S.L.T.A. in 1900.

Afternoon tea was a feature of the social life of the club. It is interesting to note that the club is celebrating its centennial this year.

For a long time the New Ork ans Lawn Tennis Club was the only club of consequence in the south. In the late 80's and 90's there were good courts in other cities such as Atlanta, Nashville, Knoxville, and Montgomery. The Atlanta Athletic Club was organized in 1898 and built two courts in downtown Atlanta. Early tournaments were held here and several of the better players were developed here.

At this point it might be of interest to look at the member clubs in the Southern in 1936. (The earliest year available to the writer at this point.

A CHRONOLOGICAL REVIEW OF THE S.T.A.

1884-87 U.S.T.A. "Lawn Tennis Records" makes no mention of tournaments.

1888-1889 Some tournament results are listed but nothing on Southern.

1890 The Lawn Tennis Guide lists the Southern Championships being held in Wilmington, Delaware. No results given.

1891 The Lawn Tennis Guide lists E. L. Hall as winner of the Southern.

1892 The Southern Championships were played at the Bachelor's Club, Washington, D. C. on May 24, 1892. This guide shows that E. L. Hall lost to A. E. Wright. Our present records show E. L. Hall retaining his title. It is obvious that in those days there were two "Southern" Tournaments. One of these embraced an area much larger than that which we consider the S.T.A. Section. From the years 1886 to 1893 the Southern States

Sectional Championships were held in Washington, D. C, Wilmington, Del. and Baltimore, Md. These locations are now in the Mid-Atlantic Section. It is possible they were part of the Southern Section at that time. It is interesting to note that there were two championships played in 1888. The spring chamoionship was won by A. H. S. Post and the fall one was won by F.

Mansfield.

1894 The Lawn Tennis Guide shows the 1894 champsionship was again played at the Bachelor's Club in Washington, D. C. and was won by Gordon Parker.

1896 The 1896 tournament was played at the Bachelor's Club, Washington, D. C. on May 19 and won by J. P. Paret should be noted that in 1894 the word "open" begins to appear. This certainly doesn't mean the same as we think of it today. 1897 The 1897 tournament was played at the Bachelor's Club in Washington, D. C. and won by T. A. Driscoll. 1898 The championship was won by J. C. Davidson, May 17 1898 at the Bachelor's Club, Washington, D. C. He successfully defended in 1899 at the same location. 1900 J. P. Paret won at the Bachelor's Club. Miss Marion Jones 1901 R. D. Little the championship winner. defeated Miss E. H. Moore in 5 sets! This is the first time the U. S. T.A. Guide mentions women competing in this event. 1902 The championship again held at the Bachelor's Club, May 26, 1902 was won by R. D. Little over F. Geoghegan. Miss E. H. Moore won from Miss Banks. In the doubles, paret and W. C. Grant defeate Davidson and Glazebrook. 1903 The Tournament was again played at the Bachelor's Club. F. Geoghegan beat R. D. Little to turn the tables from the 1902 results. W. C. Grant and R. LeRoy defeated J. C. Davidson and L. W. Glazebrook. In the women's singles Miss Closterman defeated Miss Moore. It is interesting to note that the price of the Lawn Tennis 1904 Guide for the year 1905 sold for 10 cents. H. F. Allen defeated Frank Geoghegan in mens singles. Davidson and L. W. Glazebrook beat Allen and Pill. The women's singles was won by Miss C. B. Neely over Miss M. A. Spurgin. J. C. Davidson defeated H. F. Allen in men's singles. 1905 singles Miss Marie Warner defeated Miss Carrie Neely. The men's doubles winners were W. A. Larned and L. W. Glazebrook over Gordon and Colston. S. L.T.A. officers for 1906-1907 were: 1906 Atlanta, Ga. C. Williams President Nashville, Tennessee Norman Farrell, Jr. Vice President L. D. Scott Atlanta, Ga. Sect-Treas. For the first time the championships were held in the south.

The competition was held on the courts of the Atlanta Athletic

Club on July 3 - 7, 1906.

The 1895 tournament was played at the Catonsville C. C.,

Baltimore, Md., won by A. H. S. Post.

R. G. Hunt from California defeated Dr. Karl Little B. M. Grant and Nat Thornton defeated R. G. Hunt and W. G. Lee.

B. M. Grant was the father of Bryan "Bitsy" Grant and Nat Thornton is a well-known name in the history of Tennis in Atlanta. Their pictures hang on the wall of the Atlanta Tennis Center which is named after "Bitsy" Grant.

The Women's division was won by Miss May Logan over Miss Kathleen Brown.

1907

The championships were held again at the Atlantic Athletic Club. Nat Thornton defeated Bates for the championship. Bates defeated B. M. Grant in the semi-finals.

In the doubles Grant and Thornton beat the Rodger brothers from Knoxville, Tennessee.

The women's singles was won by May logan of New Orleans, La over Miss Stores.

Nat Thornton retired the Challenge Bowl for his third win in singles. Names on the cup were C. B. Doyle (Washington), T. R. Pell (N.Y.), R. G. Hunt (California).
